## Plandome Heights Sets Tentative Budget for 2017 -18; Complies with the Tax Cap

**March 6, 2017** – On March 6, 2017 the Trustees of the Village of Plandome Heights approved a Tentative Budget for the fiscal year June 1, 2017 – May 31, 2018. A Public Hearing on the Tentative Budget will be held on Monday, April 3, 2017 at the Village Annual Meeting which starts at 7:00 p.m. The budget is due in the latter part of April 2017.

The property tax increase, 1.5%, is within the Village Property Tax Cap and represents an increase of approximately \$15 per year for the average resident. Taxes in the Village remain significantly below the taxes for the same services outside the Village. This is due to the extensive use of volunteers and other factors.

<u>Revenues</u> – The Tentative Budget calls for total revenues of \$454,700, a 1.6% increase over \$447,500 which includes: (a) non-property tax revenues of \$124,700, a 1.6% increase over \$122,500 in the prior year budget, and (b) property tax revenues of \$330,000, a 1.5% increase over \$325,000 in the prior year budget. The 2017 – 2018 property tax increase of 1.5% is within our Village Property Tax Cap.

<u>Expenditures</u> - The 2017 - 2018 Tentative Budget calls for expenditures of \$454,700 which is a <u>1.6% increase</u> in costs compared to the 2016 - 2017 Budget of \$447,500. The Village's sanitation costs decreased modestly in the Tentative Budget as a result of a competitive bid completed in 2017. With this reduction, we were able to limit the overall increase in costs to 1.6% to cover the modest increases in other costs

<u>Commentary</u> - Commenting on the Tentative Budget, Mayor Kenneth C. Riscica said: "Our Tentative Budget continues our practice of *low and stable* property taxes as well as *compliance with the Tax Cap*. Our taxes remain significantly lower than the same services outside our Village largely because more than 35 residents volunteer their time. Further, by "*planning beyond one year*" we maintain the stability to support the long-term capital needs of the Village and to cushion surprises. In fact, in March 2017, NY State Comptroller assigned our Village a fiscal stress score of zero (low stress) on a scale of 0 - 100. The Village is fortunate to have skilled volunteers on our Board who deliver these results."
